As we move into this **New Year 2010** the opportunity for God's new day at WPC begins to show itself—make its self manifest—to use the language of Epiphany. We see God doing a new thing with the Ordination and Installation of newly elected Church Officers on Sunday, January 10th. At our Annual Congregational Meeting we review the recent past with expectation of improving the present and future. Our Church Officers will gather in a Church Officer Training Event on Saturday, January 16th **to give focus and direction to our ministry as guided by our recently passed Mission Vision Report**. Now is the time we begin to set goals and plan for the coming year's programs and activities.

As each of us reflects on the old and plans for the new and offer our time and skills to shape our future, **what does this meditation say to you?**

**This is the beginning of a New Day!

What's So Special About January's Calendar?

Epiphany Day is January 6th, and may be thought of as the end of the Christmas Season. The word *epiphany* means 'manifestation' or 'showing forth' and this day gathers a number of traditional themes:

- The birth of Jesus as God's incarnation;
- The coming of the Magi;
- Christ's baptism in the Jordan; and,
- Jesus' first miracle at the wedding at Cana.

All of these events make 'manifest' Jesus as being the Christ, God-with-us, the Light of the World.

The Sunday following Epiphany celebrates the inauguration of Jesus' ministry in his baptism by John in the Jordan River. This day, then continues the Epiphany emphasis on 'manifesting' Jesus as the Christ of God. In particular, the Baptism of the Lord is connected with our baptisms; and, we remember that in baptism we are claimed by Christ to share in his ministry. It is, therefore, a day to renew baptismal vows and to reaffirm our commitment as disciples of the Risen Christ. The liturgical color is *white*, because this is a festival of Christ.

The period from the Second Sunday after Epiphany to the Transfiguration of the Lord is 'ordinary time,' which is neither a time of preparation nor of festival. The liturgical color is green, suggesting growth of plants, and is appropriate for this period when we emphasize spiritual growth and maturing.

WPC Offers Christmas Joy Through Special Offering

Thanks to all who have donated to the *Christmas Joy Offering* this past December. WPC has participated for many of the almost seventy years that the offering has been a Presbyterian Tradition. The theme of this year's offering was "What Child Is This?" Fifty percent of the receipts to the Christmas Joy Offering will be distributed to the Board of Pensions for programs that provide assistance to retired and active church workers and their spouses and families. The other 50 percent will help fund Presbyterian-related racial ethnic education through the General Assembly Mission Council. Heifer International Alternative Gift Mission Project

Deacon's Special Receptions Committee

The Deacon's Special Receptions Committee is available to provide a reception in the Parish Hall following church funeral and memorial services. At the request of the family, we arrange for and provide according to their needs a small and informal, or a larger formal reception that requires fine china, silver and centerpieces. Having access to linens, china, tables and chairs, we bake, set up, serve and clean up. Receptions are also provided for special church services, informal gatherings and notable occasions that take place within the church. We are happy to accommodate our church family at times of need.

Remember to Pay Your 2010 *Per Capita*!

Again this year the Session of Westhampton Presbyterian Church **encourages** its members to pay the *per capita* as a special, designated donation, in addition to their support of the overall church program. This will help us to move toward financial stability over the long run. To facilitate *per capita* donations, a special envelope is included in each box of offering envelopes, right at the front. Members are urged to use this envelope to make *per capita* donations for all members in the household. **In 2010, the *per capita* assessment is \$28.81 per member.**

As Presbyterians Westhampton Presbyterian Church we value greatly our connections with other Presbyterians – around the corner, and around the world. We are united by beliefs and traditions, and united in spirit and love. This unity takes tangible form when we "pool" our resources, for the purpose of doing Christ's work together. One of the ways this happens is by means of the "*per capita*" apportionment. Each congregation agrees to support the essential functions of the larger church by a donation based on membership.

The 2101 *per capita* apportionment for churches is split between the three governing bodies in this way:

- Presbytery of Long Island: \$18.81
- Synod of the Northeast: \$ 3.85
- General Assembly: \$ 6.15
- **Total per member** **\$28.81**

To assist you in your planning, the following figures are pre-computed per household:

- One member: \$28.81
- Two members: \$57.62
- Three members: \$86.43
- Four members: \$115.24
- Five members: \$144.05
- Six members: \$172.86

Since the church "covers" unpaid *per capita* donations from the operations budget, individual payment frees-up resources for other important programs and priorities and so multiply the good work it does! *Per capita* donations are welcomed all year, of course, but are especially appreciated as early in the year as possible.

News from the Board of Trustees

The Board of Trustees has been busy with snow removal. Yet that is not all they have been doing!

A number of special projects are under way in various stages:

- A bid has been accepted to have the parking lot and driveway for the church sealed to prevent further deterioration. The cracks will be filled, a seal will be placed on the whole area, and new parking lines will be painted as warmer weather returns.
- Gutter guards have been placed behind the West Wing and the Deacon's Closet overhangs to prevent leaves from clogging the

- approved special offering for Christmas bonuses for the staff;
- approved 25% of Peacemaking Offering to go for Nana's House;
- approved call for meeting of congregation/corporation meeting for Sunday, November 22, 2009;
- approved special session meeting for Sunday, Nov 15, 2009 to receive new members;
- approved the recommendation from Trustees regarding re-sealing and repainting the parking lot;
- charged the Chairperson of Finance Ministry with placing a letter in *Tidings* regarding financial status, 2009 budget, and use of Memorial & Endowment Funds;
- approved the suggested change of the By-Laws change for presentation at the congregational meeting;
- accepted with deep regret the request of Don Griffin and May Griffin to remove them from the active rolls of the church;
- renewed subscription for one copy of *Presbyterians Today* at a cost of \$19.95 to be paid from the Session Fund;
- approved the 2010 Terms of Call for Pastor Sulyok with copy to be spread upon the minutes of the session and noted the termination agreement approved the previous year is still in effect; original to be sent to the Committee on Ministry for their approval;
- charged the Nominating Committee with obtaining a slate of nine people, including youth representation (16-24 years of age), to serve on the Pastor Nominating Committee;
- approved reimbursement to Quogue Chapel Fund \$15,000 from the Elsie Plainver Fund for installation of the handicap accessible ramp at the chapel;
- elected Elder Hanne Manker as Elder Commissioner to the January 30, 2010 presbytery meeting; and,
- approved special session meeting on January 10, 2010 for the purpose of examining new officers with ordination/installation during the Service of Worship that morning.

- Two large locust trees will be removed from the back of the church where they are too close to the building and have clogged the former gutters.
- An oven has been donated to replace the no longer functioning oven in the Bailey Hall kitchenette.
- Estimates are being obtained to scrape, prime and paint the white trim at the manse and seal the porches.
- Estimates are being obtained to replace parts of the deck behind the manse where the flooring has become rotted.
- Estimates are being obtained to renovate the West Wing Hallway so that it will match the style of the hallway in the Failing Wing, thanks to the donation of an Anonymous Donor.

Anonymous Donor Gives \$30,000 for Renovation

An anonymous donor has given Westhampton Presbyterian Church \$30,000 in 2009 toward the renovation of the West Wing hallway. The Trustees have been obtaining estimates to renovate the West Wing Hallway so that it would conform to the style of the Failing Wing. Under consideration is restoring the hardwood floor under the current carpet (with a runner down the hallway), wainscoting and sheetrock walls, and a new ceiling with sunken lights for a more contemporary look. The West Wing is an important "first view" of the church for many of our visitors who enter from the parking lot and has long been in

Why Have a Personnel Committee?

Every session should have a personnel committee **to guide and support the pastors and employees** of the church. A good personnel committee:

- helps the church be a good steward of the human resources God has given it to fulfill its mission;
- cultivates an environment of support and encouragement where each member of the staff can effectively live out his or her vocation; and,
- ensures fairness and respect as the church relates to its staff.

Occasionally the personnel committee is **called on to intervene in conflict**. If the conflict is *among members of the staff*, the committee should encourage them to resolve their disagreement among themselves or, if unable to do so, to work with the pastor. The committee acts as a guide and resource for the pastor and becomes directly involved only as a last resort.

The same principle applies when conflict arises *between someone on the staff and a member of the congregation*. When approached by a member of the congregation with a grievance against a staff member, it is best to advise that person to speak directly to the person involved. If they are unwilling or unable to speak directly, the committee can work to facilitate direct communication. There are some situations, such as allegations of sexual misconduct or abuse, where it is appropriate for the personnel committee to become involved from the beginning. If there is conflict with the pastor that cannot be resolved within the church, the personnel committee should seek the help of the presbytery's committee on ministry.
