A Note From the Interim Pastor's Study

Dear Members and Friends,

Summer is here and with it a more relaxed time in our church life...

We shared lots of fun and food at the Annual Church Picnic in June. We enjoyed great food and fellowship at the Mission Vision Team's—the "Wall of Wonders"—a congregational supper and activity that helped to pull us all into the congregational mission study. More food is on the way! See inside for word on two Bagel Breakfasts—between the worship services on July 19 and August 16 as the two worshipping communities come together over food. Also, plan on attending a new event—the "Hawaiian Luau" on August 8; and, don't miss the return of the "Dinner on the Deck" on August 29.



Of course, we can't lean back and relax too far... Summer is more than a time to worry about how many calories are in an ant!

At one time in our society, it was believed one would grow up Christian almost by drinking the water. This is **not** the case today! We live in a rapidly changing environment with many competing choices. In "Why Sunday Schools Are Closing," a recent *Wall Street Journal* article claims: "Secularism and soccer games bear some of the blame." The writer also mentions a content problem: "The kind of Sunday School activities that pleased my generation simply wouldn't fly with today's busier and more sophisticated kids." Sunday School and Youth Group present a major challenge—ultimately—to all who care about responding to Christ's call to discipleship, nurturing our youngest into being disciples and witnessing to God's love and justice.

With great sadness I accepted the resignation of our Youth Ministry Coordinators Cindy and Jim Reylea. We are grateful and thankful to them for stepping in so energetically in March and showing God's love so generously to our youth, nurturing relationships and leading the youth in mission activities. They provided for us a very capable and faith-filled "interim ministry" between the Hubbards' long term ministry and our future choice. July and August offer us a brief time to look at our Children's and Youth Ministries and to talk together about what we want and are willing to give our children and youth. A youth and parent questionnaire will go out shortly where we request your guidance into the shape of our children's and youth ministries and how we can build a good and committed support structure for the ministry of our next coordinator.

As always, in our shared Interim Ministry, please do not be hesitant or consider it unimportant to involve me in your concerns. While we continue to use this time to reflect, and deal with, issues of grief and endings and trust, we are now turning more toward congregational identity and expectations for the future—our Mission Vision. Faithful Travel Series at the Manse Begins July 22nd

Pastor Peter invites you to join him and special guest Rick Steves in a summer travel series at the Manse on Wednesday nights 7:30—9:00 PM. For all who wish you were traveling this summer, but find yourself at home—travel to the Manse and beyond!

Join Pastor Peter and noted travel author and public television host Rick Steves in an exclusive, five-week journey through church history and global mission. In “Faithful Travel,” Steves lays out his personal philosophy—and theology—about the nature of “faithful travel.” Steves asks fellow travelers to consider the impact of their travel on the people they meet, to delve deeply into the wonder of God’s created world—and God’s people—and to think carefully about how their travel helps (or hinders) matters of peace and justice. Pastor Peter will lead the discussion on the video series and share his own background in sensitive global travel.

The affable television host Rick Steves reveals his sense of personal mission and poses some difficult questions about how travel changes lives forever. In short, this video is NOT the usual Rick Steves’ travelogue, but takes viewers inside the soul of this remarkable servant of Christ.

Come to one or attend all five exciting trips around the world:

- **July 22: Faithful Travel with Rick Steves** is an

introduction to faithful traveling. How we travel—like the rest of our life—can bring Christ’s good news to the places you visit as well as the people whom you encounter. We will share our own travel style and share and learn from each other.

- **July 29: Opening the Door to Luther** is a video journey through Lutherland! Travel with Rick from Eisleben where Luther was born to the university town of Wittenberg where he taught and preached. After a pilgrimage south to the Vatican in Rome, the video follows the tumultuous events of the Reformation at Worms, Erfurt, Eisenach, Marburg and Augsburg.
- **August 5: The Life of Apostle Paul** is a journey with Rick Steves through Turkey and Greece to introduce the Apostle Paul, Christianity’s greatest theologian and missionary.
- **August 12: Weaving a Global Neighborhood** is Rick Steves taking us to Papua New Guinea to meet a thriving local congregation as he connects viewers to the larger global community.
- **August 19: In the City for Good** allows us to join Rick Steves on a thoughtful tour of urban

ministry in South Los Angeles.

At the first meeting, we will discuss the possibilities of preparing various snacks from the locales where we will be traveling and sharing as we watch and discuss. And, who knows? Those attending might just plan a faithful travel trip lead by Pastor Peter to some exotic mission and church history locale in the new year!

Thanks for Your *Per Capita* Payments

This is the first year the Session has requested each member to pay their *per capita* apportionment—the amount Session pays for each member that goes to support the essential functions and administrative expenses of the church governing bodies. Session thanks all who have helped out so far this year.

For 2009, the *per capita* of Long Island churches is \$28.72, which is split between the three governing bodies in this way:

- Presbytery of Long Island: \$18.81;
- Synod of the Northeast: \$ 3.76; and,
- General Assembly: \$ 6.15.

Traditionally, Session absorbed these “per member” payments in the budget from general giving. To balance the budget this year—income and expenses—Session decided to encourage each member to make a

Mission Vision Team

The Mission Vision Team has dedicated the month of June to obtaining information about who we are as a church and what we feel are our strengths and weaknesses. We are polling the congregation weekly and trying to meet with the various boards and groups within the church with questions specific to them.

The congregation was our largest group with well over one hundred responses given to the U.S. Congregational Life Survey given in the worship service on June 14. This is said to be the largest and most representative survey of worshipers ever conducted in the United States. In about a month we will receive a summary of the responses given, with a profile showing who we are, our church backgrounds, and our involvement in the congregation's activities and ministries.

We are also asking a question a week of the congregation on a bulletin insert, which lately has been averaging forty responses per question. Questions so far have asked what is the one main thing about WHP that makes you come to church on Sunday, make three wishes for the church that you would most like to see happen, what church activities have you enjoyed the most, and what one thing would you change about our worship service if you could? If you have missed any of these you are welcome to write responses even now and put them in Stu Wood's mailbox at church.

There is a really clear pattern emerging from every one of the questions asked of any group, and that is that we all value the family feeling we get from knowing and interacting with the people of the church. For example, on the question of which church activities you enjoyed the most, there were sixty-six different responses, almost all of them dealing with small groups which involved fellowship, such as adult Sunday school, pot luck dinners, and the church picnic. One respondent mentioned building maintenance, and although I'm not sure what it means, I will bet that it means the fun of working with other people on a project, and getting to know them well. Most of the responses were of that type.

We asked the Deacons what aspects they find most satisfying and the responses followed the same pattern: collaborating with fellow Deacons and getting to know them; visitations with shut-ins, bringing joy to those in need. There's a moral here, and it is that the more involvement each of us has in the life of the church the happier we will be and the stronger the

church will be.

You will hear much more about what we have learned at the end of the summer, when we will want to hear your comments and further questions before we write our vision of what the church is and wants to be.

The Deacon's Fund

The Deacon's actions consist of:

- Visiting and keeping in touch with the home-bound
- Distributing Sunday altar flowers
- Coordinating Sunday ushers and providing acolytes the second Sunday of each month
- Running and organizing the Deacon's closet
- Transporting people
- Keeping the food flowing into the food pantry
- Organizing and baking for special receptions
- Assembling and distributing Thanksgiving baskets

The Deacon's, however, do work with a budget. The Deacon's Fund supports the youth group when asked, special receptions, and special requests from church members through an Emergency Fund. We strive to keep the church together. At this time, however; the Deacon's fund consists of a few hundred dollars—not enough to support our needs. We usually operate on a yearly budget of \$2,000-\$3,000. We, therefore, are initiating a quarterly offering with Session approval to be used specifically for the Deacon's Fund. Please keep an eye out for the envelope marked "Deacon's Fund". Envelopes may be placed in the offering plate.

Eat, Pray, Love

by Elizabeth Gilbert:

Ever felt overwhelmed? Wish you could just take a break from life? Long to get back to basics? Then this is the book for you. This beautifully written, heartfelt memoir touched a nerve among both readers and reviewers. Elizabeth Gilbert tells how she made the difficult choice to leave behind all the trappings of modern American success (marriage, house in the country, career) and find, instead, what she truly wanted from life. Setting out for a year to study three different aspects of her nature amid three different cultures, Gilbert explored the art of pleasure in Italy (pasta, wine, handsome men speaking a beautiful language), the art of devotion in India (waking at 4:15 to scrub the Ashram floor), and then worked on finding the balance of the two on the Indonesian island of Bali.

REACH WorkCampers Go to Niagara Falls

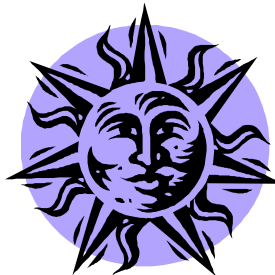
