A Note from the Interim Pastor's Study

Dear Members and Friends,

Youth Sunday occurs on May 11th—**the Day of Pentecost**—this year and we are in for a treat as they are “led by the Spirit” to give a youthful spirit to our worship. Join with me as I sit in the pew and our own youth witness to the Spirit of God through their self-selected theme and creative worship.



The **Day of Pentecost** is the day in the church calendar that we traditionally think of as the “birthday of the church.” It is the day God’s Holy Spirit came to the disciples as they gathered and spoke in many languages telling the Good News of Jesus to the world.

The novelist Frederick Buechner helps to point to the power of God’s Holy Spirit when he witnesses:

God is the power of the power of life itself, has breathed and continues to breathe Godself into creation. In-spires it. The spirit of God, Holy Spirit, Holy Ghost, is highly contagious. When Peter and his friends were caught up in it at Jerusalem on Pentecost, everybody thought they were drunk even though the sun wasn’t yet over the yardarm (Acts 2). They were.

God longs for the day when **all** in the church family will be drunk on the Holy Spirit, rather than materialism or military power or the power of money or any other false idols we tend to worship before the God who loves us. With Pentecost comes a reflection on what the church is and how it helps to shape life in the community.

Pentecost, occurring in the spring, always seems to be a time for fresh growth and new life. Pentecost has the mood of **joy** because the promise of Jesus to send the Spirit was fulfilled and the gift was received. It is the joy of a birthday party! It is a time to **celebrate!**

We also express **gratitude** during the season of Pentecost—stretching now until the First Sunday of Advent. With Christians, we are grateful for the Spirit and the sevenfold gifts. The Spirit brings life; some say the Spirit is the feminine side of God that calls, enlightens and gathers believers into the church. Since the church is the product of the Spirit, we are grateful on Pentecost for the church as the mother of our faith.

Hope results from the Spirit’s making all things new. Pentecost is a renewal and revival day in the church. The Spirit is renewed in the faithful. With the Spirit comes new life and hope!

As always, in our shared Interim Ministry, please do not be hesitant or consider it unimportant to involve me in your concerns. This is the time to reflect, and deal with, issues of grief and endings, trust, congregational identity, and expectations for the future. I am in the office Mondays and Wednesdays from 9:00 am-12:00

Presbytery. We're looking forward to spending the weekend at the camp with other Presbyterian youth and learning about our Lord.

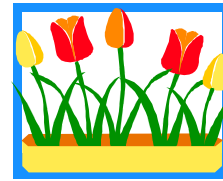

These items are available (at no charge) for our members as well as to the general public. This equipment is donated to the church and the Deacons (along with our "on the spot" office personnel) are able to distribute these to people in need of them. These can be delivered when needed, or picked-up at the church.

The closet is usually very well stocked, with these items, but for whatever reason ... we are always in need of wheelchairs. There is a greater demand than we can supply. If you have a wheelchair (that is not in use of course) please consider donating it to those who could really use it. We would be more than happy to pick it up for you.

A Few Days in April

The traditional Trinitarian formula, established at the Council of Nicea, in 325 AD, describes

God as “One God in three Persons”—Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The relationship of these three persons to each other is then clarified, in that the Son is begotten of the Father. In the next council, in 381, it was further clarified that the Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father. A few centuries later in the Western half of the church, it was added that the Holy Spirit proceeds both from the Father and the Son. This addition is still a cause of friction and disagreement between Eastern and Western churches. The formula intends to stress the unity of God.

The language of the original formula is clearly a problem for many, but care needs to be taken to understand what was at stake originally. In the same way that a human child shares the same humanity as the parents, so, too, the One who became incarnate as Jesus of Nazareth is completely God. Separate beings were not meant: common divinity was. Parent and offspring would be non-gender-specific renderings.

Session Retreat to Plan Mission Study Opportunities

At the April meeting Session agreed to have an “evening retreat” on Thursday, May 29th, 7:00-9:30 pm, to begin plans for the Mission Study. A Mission Study is required by each church prior to nominating a Pastor Nominating Committee charged with seeking the next pastor.

The Mission Study Process will attempt to include all congregation members in some way to help shape the future mission and work of the congregation. The Mission Study is helpful in the development of the *Church Information Form (CIF)* used to describe the congregation and its ministry, mission, and hopes for the future for those Pastors who will be interested in serving at WPC.

Session will also give thought to a proposed time-line for the Mission Study and Pastor Nominating Search. The evening will be an important time for Session to think through the search process and make sure that we are able to include as many in the congregation as possible in different aspects of the Mission Study. The more people that are involved in the study, the stronger the consensus for support for the goals and objectives for the church resulting from the study; hence, also, the better the match of pastor with our congregation’s hopes and directions.

Note that Session at this meeting will **not** focus on “what” the Mission Study will say, but rather “how” the congregation will discover the “what”!

Coffee with the Session

The Session held a “Coffee with the Session” discussion and learning meeting with congregation members Sunday, April 20th following worship. Chairs of the Session Ministries shared work that is currently underway and how members can volunteer and do ministry.

Spiritual Conversations on the Parables

The first Sunday of the month is “Spiritual Conversations on the Parables” led by Valerie O’Brien and meeting around the “kitchen table.” Join in for this engaging discussion of the parables applied to our daily living.



SESSION ACTIONS: February - April

With bad weather and a meeting of the Presbytery of Long Island scheduled for one of our regular meeting nights, the “Regular” meetings of the session have been anything but regular. Therefore *Tidings* deadlines have been missed and we have been unable to get the actions the Session has taken to you in a timely manner. Below are the actions the Session has taken over the past couple of months.

-Pursuant to G-10.0302b (1), Form of Government, *Book of Order, The Constitution of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.)*, to issue per their request a letter of transfer for Chris and Jamie Osborne to the First Presbyterian Church of East Moriches.

-The Session was informed that the Session Fund is very low on funds. Therefore, Session voted \$5000.00 be taken from the WPC Combined Fund and transferred to the Session Fund for future disbursements as Session sees fit.

-The Clerk presented the 2007 Church Record that was forwarded to the General Assembly on February 17, 2008. Motion was made that said report be received and a copy be spread upon the minutes of the Session.

-The Session received and approved a request from Nicole and Robert Schindler to baptize their son, Cole Richie Schindler during the Service of Worship on Sunday, May 4, 2008.

-The Session approved renewal of the Interim Pastoral relationship with Pastor Sulyok for the period January 1, 2008 through December 31, 2008. Terms of Call were ordered spread upon the minutes of the Session.

SESSION ACTIONS

-The Session voted to elect Elder Karen Derryberry as the Session representative to the Memorial and Endowment Committee.

-The next Presbytery of Long Island meeting will be held on April 8, 2008 at the Presbyterian Church of Oyster Bay. Elder Perry was elected as our Elder Commissioner for that meeting. Also that meeting of the presbytery is scheduled for the night of the April meeting of the session. Discussion ensued about possibility of rescheduling the session meeting. The Session voted to change the April session meeting to Tuesday, April 1, 2008.

-The Worship Ministry and the Session affirmed the congregation's request for reinstatement of a Cherub Choir. The Session voted to offer the position of Cherub Choir Director as a volunteer position, if possible, and if a volunteer does not come forward the Personnel Committee is authorized to develop a position description and the position will be offered as a stipend position. In either case it will be communicated to the congregation that the opening exists.

-Upon recommendation from the Worship Ministry the session amended the action of December 4, 2007 with respect to the scheduled celebration of the Lord's Supper on Sunday, May 11, 2008 (Confirmation Sunday) and the celebration was changed to Sunday, June 1, 2008. (This is the **new date** for receiving our Confirmation class into the church.)

-The Youth Ministry was given

permission to place donation envelopes in the pews from April 6-27 to raise additional funds for the 2008 Youth Ministry trips.

-The session endorsed a Mission Auction to be held on May 16, 2008 to raise funds for the Youth Mission trips.

- Church Life was given permission to purchase a digital camera for use by that ministry as well as any other committees/ministries of the church. Request was approved in the amount of \$250.00 to come from the Session Fund.

-The Session voted to take out a business card sized advertisement in the East End Hospice Summer Gala Program with money to come from the Session Fund.

-After a discussion about the offering collected on Maundy Thursday the Session approved a motion that when WPC hosts the Maundy Thursday Service of Worship the offering, excluding checks with a designated purpose, will be split equally among the participating churches. A further motion was made that when the refreshments are donated at ecumenical services any free will offering will be offered as donation to the Greater Hampsons Interfaith Council.

-The Clerk of Session was directed to send a "Thank You" the John and Meryle King for their thirty one years of devotion in providing the refreshments at the Easter morning Sunrise Service.

-The Session voted to concur with the pastor's proposal to hold a "Coffee with the Session"

on April 20, 2008 at 11:15 A.M.

In addition, reports from the Pastor, Board of Trustees, Board of Deacons and the Seminarian were received.

TRINITY SUNDAY

What is essential is the imagery of "begotten," which shows the relationship of the two. No subordination is intended by the wording. Furthermore, the entirety of the Godhead is involved in creation and redemption, and any attempt to picture the First Person as a demanding Judge in contrast to the Second Person who is a loving Redeemer does violence to the unity of God's work with us. Yet distinctions are also necessary, particularly that it is the Second Person only who became incarnate.

Trinity Sunday gives the Church a change to reflect on the understanding of God's work with and for us, and helps us to understand the name into which we have been baptized. [From Catherine G. Gonzales, professor of Church History, Columbia Theological Seminary, Decatur, Georgia.]
